OBTAINING REFUSAL-OF-CARE AUTHORIZATIONS

Any time you assume care of a patient and that care is terminated without properly turning over the care of the patient to a person who can offer equal or better treatment, then you are unnaturally terminating the care of that patient. When this done, you must complete an EMS Refusal of Care Authorization form. This form can be found inside the clipboard of your apparatus.

Not long ago, emergency responders extricated a woman from an inverted vehicle. When access to the patient was gained and they attempted to place a c-collar, the patient refused to allow them to proceed, very forcefully saying she didn't want to be placed inside the ambulance nor did she want to go to the hospital.

Considering the mechanism-of-injury being the rolling and position of the vehicle, as well as her combativeness, the index of probability of having a head, neck and/or back injury was high. The EMT on the scene properly advised the patient of the hazards of not seeking ambulance transport and a doctor's evaluation, including the possibility of trauma caused by this type of incident.

Her verbal and physical combativeness continued and led to her being cuffed and placed into the back of a police unit. Being combative and cuffed, it was difficult to obtain a properly signed Refusal-of-Care from her.

In this situation you must document thoroughly. The EMT on the scene placed the words "patient unable to sign" in the signature blank and described the circumstances of why the patient was unable to sign. He gathered as much information on the patient as possible, obtain witnesses signatures from responders in different agencies such as MPD and the ambulance service. Then, upon returning to the station, he described the scene, patient condition, actions taken, advice given to the patient and the patient's reaction in her own words completely in the narrative section of the patient report in HTE.
